Setting up a Google Domain

Before you start

Have you got a school credit card to pay £10-20 a year for the domain hosting? A domain is the web and email name Google will use. Don't try and use your xxxxxxx.hants.sch.uk one as this will cause major problems as well as being a long thing to type in for younger pupils.

Think of a shortened name you might use.

For Ringwood Junior we went for rjs1.co.uk (someone else had rjs.co.uk already)

For Otterbourne primary we went for otterbourne.org

Do you have all your school details? It will help speed things up if you use an official email address!

Navigate to

https://gsuite.google.com/signup/edu/welcome#0

Fill in all the school details and address details.

When you get to

Does your institution have a domain?

You'll need a domain, like *example.edu*, to set up email and a G Suite for Education account for your institution.


